RECYCLING GUIDELINES

For the health and safety of our workers, please make sure all recyclable materials in your curbside bins are washed out, clean, and following the below guidelines.

GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS: We are now accepting clean and washed out glass in your curbside recycling bin.

Please DO NOT place the following products in your curbside recycling container:

NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM: We cannot accept plastic bags in your curbside recycling bin. Plastic bags can be recycled at most local grocery stores.

NO GARBAGE

NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTICS: We accept plastics #1-7 but there are some plastics that are not recyclable. These products include Styrofoam, hard plastic items including toys, plastic chairs, flower pots, PVC pipes and any other plastic products that are not listed in these guidelines.

NO LIQUIDS OR FOOD RESIDUE: Please completely empty and rinse out all containers before recycling.

NO CERAMICS OR OTHER GLASS PRODUCTS: Do not place glass, ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, porcelain, or window glass in your curbside recycling container.

NO SCRAP METAL: Do not place scrap metal items of any size in your curbside recycling container.

NO ELECTRONICS: Do not place electronic devices in your curbside recycling container.

NO HAZARDOUS WASTE: We do not accept hazardous waste such as oil-based paint, automotive fluids, car batteries, fertilizers or pesticides. Latex paint recycling locations can be found on PaintCare.org.



Dog Barking Reminder!

Dogs left alone all day get bored and restless, and many find relief in barking. Some respond noisily to any and all activity. But, nothing is as annoying as incessant barking even for dog lovers. If your dog is

a yapper or a yowler, please consider some of these barkabatement ideas to keep the noise down in your area. Your neighbors will thank you!

Training. Always the first recommendation for any behavioral problem! Help is as close as the Yellow Pages.

Training not only helps your dog; you'll be surprised how much it helps you, too. You may get some insight into why your dog barks so much, or what it is trying to communicate.

Citronella collars. A humane alternative to the electric-shock, anti-barking collar and costs about the same. Available on the web and in pet stores.

Confinement. Sometimes simply bringing an outspoken dog indoors or confining it to a crate can cut down on the disturbance to neighbors.

Reduce stimulus. Close drapes to help muffle street noise, or leave a radio on to mask it. Disconnect telephones and doorbells before leaving your home if they upset your dog or make it bark.

Companionship. Dogs are pack animals; they need companionship—a cat, bird, or another dog. Consider a midday visit from a pet-sitting service, or drop your pooch off at a friend's place or a day-care facility once or twice a week.

Question:

What are some top things buyers look for in a Stonegate home?

Answer:

The number one item that a buyer wants is a well-maintained home. When we show homes, it is easy to see who has taken care of their home and who hasn't. Simple things like sprinklers that work and are adjusted well, windows that don't have condensation in them or are new, roofs that have been maintained and are not the original cedar shake shingles, holes in walls, etc. The second item would be the lot. Buyers want a private backyard where they and their pets can play. We all love to soak up the Colorado sun on the deck. An outdoor space is important to buyers. Another essential thing is upgrades. They don't have to be the most trendy, expensive, and fancy upgrades, although those will bring a premium in the price. Replacing those original brass faucets, doorknobs and hinges is a must in a home and can drastically change its appearance. We know gold is in right now, but it is different than the brass knobs initially installed in your home. Updated neutral paint colors will make your home appeal to most buyers. Feature walls, shiplap, and stone fireplaces are a big eyecatcher, and they can change a room and make your home sell fast. April Showers Will Leave Room for Gardening!

As regular snowstorms continue to roll in and out (with the snow barely melting in between them!), it can be hard to believe we will be out working in our yards again anytime soon. But as fast as the storms have been coming, they will also come to an end, welcoming us to return outside for much needed sun. And though a few more snowstorms may be lurking in the wings waiting to complicate life for eager vegetable gardeners, there will be plenty to do outside in early spring.

Lawns are often the first concern of homeowners once the weather starts warming up. They will benefit from springtime core aeration which provides air and increased access to water and nutrients to grass roots. Make sure the cores are 3-4" apart (this is usually at least two passes with a mechanical core-aerator). Fertilizer can be

applied in April (see fact sheet 7.202, Lawn Care, for details). Once nighttime temperatures are consistently above freezing, bluegrass, rye, and fescue are safe to plant, and it may also be wise to ensure irrigation systems are in working order.

In the flower beds, it is time to clear off debris and leaves, cut back ornamental grasses, and prune summer-blooming shrubs such as blue mist spirea (*Caryopteris clandonensis*) or butterfly bush (*Buddleia cvs*). It's best to transplant summer- and fall-blooming perennials now (spring and early summer bloomers can often be transplanted in late summer). The moist soil is also a boon to planting affordable bare-root plants, such as roses. Be sure to soak roots for 12 hours prior to planting. For established roses, begin removing mulch around mid-April as new growth begins. Wait to prune though until late May (other than removing dead canes, which can be done any time). Fertilize only if soil tests indicate deficiency.

The wet conditions often experienced in April in Colorado present an opportunity to add more flowers to your beds by direct-seeding perennials like delphiniums, columbines, and daisies. Or if you prefer, you can start seeds indoors for "warm-season" flowers such as celosia, petunia, or marigold.

As you work in the lawn and flower beds, keep an eye out for easily plucked, still small weeds. Removing them now before they go to seed and while they uproot easily saves more labor coping with them later in the season. Also take a look at your trees and shrub branches. Prune any dead or broken branches and look at tree trunks for signs and symptoms of injury or pests. If you are interested in adding trees, spring is a great time to plant new ones, as well as shrubs. Ensure new plantings are adequately watered. You can find more information from CSU Extension and from the Colorado State Forest Service.

Attending to plants' needs in the yard early in the season pays off for the rest of the growing season and beyond. But no one needs much encouragement to get outside and enjoy the fresh air and sunshine in spring!

Seven Things You Should Know Before May 29th

A Quick Q&A on Mobile Access Passes through VIZpin

Why Do I Need a Mobile Access Pass?

Stonegate North Villages elected to move to a technology-based access system last year. This new system provides residents the ability to use their mobile phone as their key to both the North Pool and the Tennis Courts. In addition to being contactless, it has given the district tremendous insights on facility usage and greatly improved control over access.

How many Mobile Access Passes can our household have?

Each household is eligible to apply for up to 6 free Mobile Access Passes for household members living at your address. These passes will result in a Smartkey for each family member. Please note they are not transferable.

What about kids? And what if I have accessibility needs?

Each member of the household over the age of 18 will need their own Mobile Access Pass. Youth ages 10-18 may have their own pass, if guardians desire, provided they have a smartphone. Any resident who has accessibility needs, or does not own a smartphone, should contact the office at contact@stonegatenorthvillages. org or by phone at 720-851-8178.

I have an email that says my application has been approved, but nothing else has happened. What do I do next?

After the district has verified your residency, you will receive an initial email message that says, "Congratulations! You have been authorized as a user of the Stonegate North Villages facilities, including the pool and the tennis courts." This message serves to let you know that your application was approved by the district and you are ready for the next step.

The next steps are initiated by you.

You will simply read the directions in that initial email message ensuring you download the VIZpin app and complete the process on your smartphone. Please note that after you download VIZpin, enter the Location ID and request access that it may still take up to 3 business days for the Smartkeys to be activated in your app on your phone. By simply refreshing the app you will be able to check and see when your Smartkeys show up. Once your Smartkeys are visible and you are in proximity of the gate, you will be able to enter the North Pool or Tennis Courts. As a reminder, each member of your household over the age of 18 will require their own Mobile Access Pass and resulting Smartkey.

I applied but have not seen an approval. How do I check on the status?

Before following up with the district, please check your spam folder. If you do not see your authorization email in your spam folder, then feel free to reach out to us at contact@stonegatenorthvillages.

Will our Mobile Access Passes/ Smartkeys from VIZpin work for the other pool?

No. If you would like to use the pool at Stonegate Village, often called the South Pool, you will need to ensure you have a traditional card-based pool pass and access through their district process. You may visit that district's website at: www.svmd.org to learn more and register.

When does the pool open this year? The Stonegate North Villages pool will open on May 29th!

If you are new to the area or have not yet registered, you can learn more by visiting the facilities page on the website at: stonegatenorthvillages. org/apply-for-a-pass/ to learn more. Please note that those renting homes may need to provide a current, updated lease to ensure ongoing access.
