Brighten Up Those Long Winter Days With a Cheerful, Blooming Houseplant!



Winter is settling in with snow and cold, summer temperatures and outdoor gardening are still months away, and you are missing your beautiful flowers – what are your options to bring that beauty inside?

If you are like me, you cannot wait to get back outside, put your hands into the soil and start growing things. Unfortunately, our Colorado climate allows a shortened growing season at best. However, I find that a few flowering indoor houseplants quench that thirst for beautiful blooms until summer comes.

Among the plants that bloom and thrive indoors are begonia, kalanchoe, orchid, cyclamen, the peace lily, and others. And these plants are usually quite easy to find – they can often be found at your local grocery store's floral department or a big-box retailer's gardening section. For a greater selection and more varieties, check out a local nursery.

Let's focus on a couple of easy-to-grow blooming indoor plants (and one that's a bit more challenging) that can really liven up your home this winter. These houseplants also have interesting leaves that you can appreciate on their own merits. As foliage plants they will always look good, and any blooms you receive will be a bonus.

First off, consider the petite and compact African violet. I remember my mother and grandmother grew these for years – they even had some plants for decades! There is something about their delicate, old-fashioned purple, pink, and white blooms that is just irresistible. They are also known for their thick dark green and fuzzy leaves.

African violets flower almost continuously and will flourish if kept in bright, warm, and humid conditions. They don't require full sun, and actually

Soil, mulch, clippings, fertilizer and other gardening materials contain nutrients like nitrogen and phosphorous. When carried with stormwater or excess irrigation into stormdrains and into our waterways, these nutrients can contribute to algae blooms and reduce oxygen in the water. This kills healthy aquatic life and fish, and adversely affects our fresh drinking water supply.

Proper waste disposal prevents water pollution.

Follow these garden center and landscape operations disposal and storage best practices:



- 1. Train new and current employees in best cleanup practices and regularly review.
- 2. Store fertilizers and soil products off the ground, indoors or under cover where they are not exposed to stormwater.
- 3. Ensure gardening product bags are securely closed and not torn, leaking or spilling.
- 4. Maintain proper irrigation to reduce overwatering and water waste that could run into a stormdrain.
- 5. Immediately clean up any spills of fertilizers, soils, potted plant materials, etc.
- 6. Use a dumpster for solid waste, like litter, landscape clippings, building materials, etc.
- 7. Find and use a designated disposal site for chemicals.
- 8. Clean up chemical spills with cat litter or other dry material not water and dispose of it in the trash.
- 9. Do not wash excess fertilizers, lawn clippings, soil, or other products into stormdrains.
- 10. Do not place or dump landscape materials on public roads or near stormdrains.

We need your help. Stormdrains lead directly to the creek. Keeping waste from reaching our waterways creates a healthier environment for our community. Keeping waste from reaching our treatment plants reduces the need for aggressive and costly treatment processes.

It is illegal to intentionally or accidentally dump anything down the stormdrain. (Municipal code 4.03.80)

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

For the health and safety of our workers, please make sure all recyclable materials in your curbside bins are washed out and clean and follow the below quidelines.

ACCEPTABLE RECYCLING ITEMS

- Empty and rinse all containers
- Place recyclables loose and unbagged in your recycling container
- Flatten all cardboard and paperboard boxes
- Place your recycling container 4ft from parked cars and other obstacles

NOT ACCEPTABLE RECYCLING ITEMS

1. What items CAN NOT be recycled?

Please DO NOT place the following products in your curbside recycling container. NO GARBAGE | NO PLASTIC BAGS | NO PLASTIC FILM | NO STYROFOAM®

- NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM: We cannot accept plastic bags in your curbside recycling bin. Plastic bags can be recycled at most local grocery stores.
- NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTICS: We accept plastics #1-7 but there are some plastics that are not recyclable. These products include Styrofoam, hard plastic items including toys, plastic chairs, flower pots, PVC pipes and any other plastic products that are not listed in these guidelines.
- NO LIQUIDS OR FOOD RESIDUE: Please completely empty and rinse out all containers before recycling.
- NO CERAMICS OR OTHER GLASS PRODUCTS: Do not place glass, ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, porcelain, or window glass in your curbside recycling container.
- NO SCRAP METAL: No scrap metal items of any size in your curbside recycling container.
- NO ELECTRONICS: Do not place electronic devices in your curbside recycling container.
- NO HAZARDOUS WASTE: We do not accept hazardous waste such as oil-based paint, automotive fluids, car batteries, fertilizers or pesticides. Latex paint recycling locations can be found on PaintCare.org.

Your Home Helper

We receive many questions about homes, updating, real estate and more. Our goal with this monthly column is to address commonly asked questions in Stonegate. Feel free to send your questions to Dan@SouthDenverDigs.com.

QUESTION: I am selling my house, and the buyer is requesting a radon mitigation system. What is that, and why is one needed?

Answer: Great question. Radon has been a big topic recently. The Colorado Senate passed SB23-206 last year. It adds strong warnings about radon testing to all real estate transactions.

Radon is a colorless, odorless, and cancer-causing radioactive gas that is the second-leading cause of lung cancer next to cigarettes! Radon comes from the breakdown of uranium in the soil. It makes its way to the surface and can get caught in your home, especially the basement. Radon levels are tested during a real estate transaction. Our experience is that most homes tested in Stonegate have high concentrations of radon. Eighteen states require radon to be tested and mitigated when selling a home, but Colorado is not one of those states yet. As the market has slowed down a bit for sellers, we are seeing almost all buyers test for radon, and nearly all buyers ask for a mitigation system if the readings are high. It stands to reason that you will have to get a radon mitigation system when you sell your home. It is a great idea to test for radon now. Even if you have tested for it in the past or when you bought your home, the test results can change. Amazon sells testers starting at about \$90 or mail-in test kits for \$12. You can have your home tested by a licensed professional for \$150-\$200. Mitigation is relatively simple. A fan is added to move the air from under the floor to above the roof line. For newer homes, systems start at around \$600 and can go up to \$3000+, but most systems are around \$1300. Be sure to get approval from the HOA if you need to add a system. Let us know if you would like a referral for testing or mitigation. Stay healthy!

Short-term Rentals in Stonegate:

Please be advised that Douglas County Zoning does not allow short-term rentals (rentals of less than thirty (30) days) within a residential district. Staff at Douglas County Zoning has confirmed that a residence within a suburban residential district, such as Stonegate Village, being utilized as a short-term rental would be subject to a zoning violation. Complaints alleging short-term rental use within Stonegate can be reported to Zoning compliance, either to the Director Michael Carry or David Clements. Both Michael and David can be reached through the Zoning reception desk at 303-660-7460.

Complaint Procedure

Who May Submit Complaints?

Complaints regarding alleged violations of the Covenants, Design Guidelines or Rules and Regulations may be reported by members of the Board of Directors, members of the Community or the Association's Manager.

How Complaints Should Be Submitted.

Complaints by a member of the community shall be in writing and must include a contact name and email address or phone number in case there is an inquiry from the Board or management office regarding the complaint submitted. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. Your name and contact information will not be provided to the person you have made a complaint about; it is only needed for the management team. The member must have observed the alleged violation and shall contain the nature of the alleged violation, the location of the alleged violation and the date it was observed; photos are very helpful. A complaint may also be submitted by any member of the Board of Directors or by the Association Manager after a walk through or inspection of the Community.

prefer the indirect light from a window facing east or west. If you have only exposure to southern light, consider shading the plant somewhat with sheers or thin curtains. For best blooms, aim for 10-14 hours of sunlight a day.

These small charmers do not require much water, so water only when the soil is dry. Try watering from the bottom by putting the plant's pot (which should have drainage holes) on a shallow saucer of water. Let the plant absorb the moisture for a few hours and then remove it from the saucer and drain.

Next up is an easy-care bloomer – the Christmas cactus, named for the holiday during which it typically flowers. You may have received one of these exotic-looking plants as a gift over the holidays. It is an excellent choice for decorating your interior and will look equally great in a hanging planter or on a table. A relative of the cacti family, this plant features long-segmented "arms" or branches that spill over the pot. The beautiful blooms at the end of these arms flower at different times of the year depending on the variety of the plant.

Blooms on a Christmas cactus can range from yellow, salmon, pink, fuchsia, red, or white, or combinations of those colors – so many options! The plant will flower for four to six weeks at a time, and should be placed in an indirect, bright location. The ideal spot would be near a north or east window, getting at least 8 hours of dappled sunlight a day.

When the top third of soil is dry to the touch, water a Christmas cactus thoroughly. Make sure the water drains completely out of the bottom of the pot – they do not like "wet feet." Too much water can lead to root rot, or even plant death.

If you are up for a true growing challenge, consider the striking and especially fragrant gardenia plant. The glossy green leaves are beautiful on their own, but when coupled with its zesty-scented white blooms, you'll be sold on this plant! I have grown several over the past 20 years and while they do need more attention, the effort has been most rewarding.

While often seen as a larger shrub framing a home's exterior in southern regions of the U.S., the gardenia can also thrive as indoor houseplants in our region. Shoot for six to eight hours of indirect sunlight each day, always protected from the harsh midday sun. Too much direct sunlight will cause the leaves to yellow or burn. An area that receives morning sun and late afternoon shade is optimal.

Gardenias are very sensitive plants. Find a location you like and don't move it too often, which can stress the plant and make it lose its leaves, flowers, or buds.

Water your gardenia when the soil is dry. If the soil still feels damp, do not water. This is a good rule of thumb for most houseplants. Overwatering can lead to root rot, fewer blooms, or browning of leaves. Consider using a soil moisture reader for indoor plants, which helps to determine if the plant needs water. This is especially important in winter, when houseplants typically require less moisture. Always use room-temperature water to avoid shocking the plant.

Lastly, as with many other indoor-flowering plants, keep in mind that gardenias need humidity to grow well, especially when the drying heat of indoor furnaces kick in. If your indoor environment is too dry, try setting out a few shallow dishes of water around your plant to increase humidity, get a plant mister and mist the leaves a few times a week, or run a house humidifier. This will help your plants stay healthy and encourage more blooms.

Your interior spaces can be brightened considerably this winter with the addition of a flowering houseplant (or two). They are not too difficult to grow and the result is very satisfying. With the shorter amounts of daylight now and more cold weather ahead, enjoying a plant in full bloom just might be what carries you through until summer!

VIZpin Now is also a great time of year to think about whether your VIZpin needs any attention. If you rent and have a new lease agreement for the year, you will need to submit this current lease document. If you own and do not have a lease, and have registered in previous years, you should not need to take any action. It is suggested you open the VIZpin app on your phone and download the latest version. A reminder, your VIZpin will only work when you are standing in the vicinity of the gate. If you are new to the district, you can learn more about VIZpin and how it provides access to the district's amenities by visiting our website, then selecting the drop-down menu for Recreation & Facilities and Apply for a Pass: **stonegatenorthvillages.org/apply-for-a-pass/.**

Adult Pool & Spa There was a trespassing incident at the Adult Pool & Spa in recent weeks. Please help the board and the management team by ensuring that any time you use this facility you utilize your VIZpin to open the gate for each person, and that you close the gate behind you as well. It's also vital that residents do not disturb the neighbors and adhere to the posted hours of operation and proactively leave the facility on time.
