STONEGATE VILLAGE METROPOLITIAN DISTRICT WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS FOR 2022 AND 2023

Water

The Water Treatment Facility (WTF) had not been upgraded since the early 2000s.

Bond money was delegated for upgrade of the WTF.

The WTF consists of six greensand filters and the equipment required to operate the filters.

- Replacement of the programmable logic controller (PLC), installed in early 2000. Integration to the human machine interface (HMI) for supervisory control and data acquisition (SCADA).
- Replacement of all actuator control valves and compressors.
- Addition of new meters.
- Replacement of chemical pumps.
- Install of new pottasium permanganate tanks and secondary containment.
- Addition of building to provide storage for new chlorine disinfection tanks.
- Addition of loading dock for chemical deliveries.
- Change out reclaim constant speed pump to variable frequency drive (VFD).
- Electrical and piping upgrades.
- Upgrade of lab.
- Addition of greensand media to filters.
- Replacement of membrane roof.
- Paint WTF inside and outside.
- Additional landscaping.

The booster station consists of four pumps and the controls and equipment required to pump potable water into the distribution system.

- Upgrade two constant speed pumps to VFD's.
- Replacement of the plc, integration to the HMI for scada.
- Replacement of pipe and fixtures and upgrade electrical equipment.
- Addition of new meters.
- Install HVAC for necessary temperature control to operate equipment.

- Roof replacement.
- Painted inside and outside.
- Additional landscaping.
- New fence.

There are thirteen wells in Stonegate Village Metropolitan District (SVMD) which are used to supply potable water to the district. In addition to wells, SVMD is supplied water from the Water Infrastructure and Supply Efficiency (WISE) partnership between Denver Water, Aurora Water and ten South Metro water providers to provide a sustainable water supply.

To manage the use of SMMD's water supply, aquifer storage and recovery is required (ASR). This is the injection of water into the wells and storage until the demand is required. To achieve this selected wells have been upgraded with additional equipment.

In 2023 two wells were upgraded and in 2024 two more will be upgraded.

Wastewater

SVMD follows a long-term capital improvement plan (CIP). The Wastewater Treatment Facility (WWTF) had planned upgrades required.

- Replacement of the membranes was approved and will start taking place as early as 2025 or as late as 2029.
 This contract with Veolia was entered into in 2023.
- Optimization of the nutrient removal before discharge to the effluent stream is in progress. This is under contract with Aerzen and involves the addition of controls to maximize the use of dissolved oxygen in the process.
- An emergency bypass line has been connected to Arapahoe County Water and Wastewater Authority (ACWWA).

Irrigation Reservoir

• The irrigation reservoir holds a volume of 33 million gallons of water which is used during the summer for irrigation of the open spaces in SVMD. The liner for the reservoir was repaired along with needed replacement of dirt to protect the liner.

Modifications Committee (MC)

In order to try to improve the current homeowner design review request submittal procedure, our MC has established a process for the receipt, review and response of all future design review requests. The MC will schedule and convene meetings as necessary to review homeowner applications submitted to the management company, PCMS, based upon the following schedule: a) owner applications with all required additional documentation received by the first Friday of the month will be reviewed by the MC for response to the owner by the third Friday of the month; b) owner applications with all required additional documentation received by the third Friday of the month will be reviewed by the MC for response to the owner by the first Friday of the month. RECYCLING GUIDELINES

For the health and safety of our workers, please make sure all recyclable materials in your curbside bins are washed out and clean and follow the below guidelines.

ACCEPTABLE RECYCLING ITEMS

1. What items CAN be recycled?

Paper

mixed paper | cardboard newspapers, magazines, & catalogs cartons | paperboard phonebooks & paperback books

Metals

aluminum cans, foil, and pie plates steel cans loose metal jar lids and bottle caps

Plastics

rigid plastic | bottles and containers plastics #1-7

Glass

Clean and washed-out glass.

- Empty and rinse all containers
- Place recyclables loose and unbagged in your recycling container
- Flatten all cardboard and paperboard boxes
- Place your recycling container 4ft from parked cars and other obstacles

1. What items CAN NOT be recycled?

Please DO NOT place the following products in your curbside recycling container.

NO GARBAGE | NO PLASTIC BAGS | NO PLASTIC FILM | NO STYROFOAM®

- NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM: We cannot accept plastic bags in your curbside recycling bin. Plastic bags can be recycled at most local grocery stores.
- NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTICS: We accept plastics #1-7 but there are some
 plastics that are not recyclable. These products include Styrofoam, hard plastic
 items including toys, plastic chairs, flower pots, PVC pipes and any other plastic
 products that are not listed in these guidelines.
- NO LIQUIDS OR FOOD RESIDUE: Please completely empty and rinse out all
 containers before recycling.
- NO CERAMICS OR OTHER GLASS PRODUCTS: Do not place glass, ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, porcelain, or window glass in your curbside recycling container.
- NO SCRAP METAL: No scrap metal items of any size in your curbside recycling container.
- NO ELECTRONICS: Do not place electronic devices in your curbside recycling container.
- NO HAZARDOUS WASTE: We do not accept hazardous waste such as oil-based paint, automotive fluids, car batteries, fertilizers or pesticides. Latex paint recycling locations can be found on PaintCare.org.

Your Home Helper

We receive many questions about homes, updating, real estate and more. Our goal with this monthly column is to address commonly asked questions in Stonegate. Feel free to send your questions to Dan@SouthDenverDigs.com.

Question: My parents are ageing and we are considering having them move in to our home. Is this a good idea? Can you give us any tips?

Answer: You are not alone! According to a recent study by Generations United, 1 in 4 Americans live in a multigenerational home. In the past 10 years multigenerational living has gone from 7% of households to 26%! The cost of living, and the cost of nursing homes and assisted livinghave made multigeneration living more popular. We also see kids and grandkids moving back in with parents as young families are dealing with higher housing costs. We have helped several families find homes in multigenerational situations. Since we are experts at housing and not so much at family therapy, we asked our clients. Here is what they say. Boundaries was the #1 answer. Having a space to be together, but also a space to be apart was key. Most recommended two separate cooking/eating areas. One family compared too much time together to eating ice cream for every meal. Scheduling was a close second. Often the middle generation would expect their parents to babysit and find scheduling conflicts. They suggested a large calendar in a central area with color coding for family members and events. Communication was a common complaint. One family suggested a weekly family planning meeting with everyone involved. Every family with kids moving back in reported difficulty in changing from parent roles to roommate roles. Food was another common issue. Knowing who was planning, shopping, and cooking items that pleased everyone was difficult. Most issues were resolved with some communication and love. Almost everyone that had been in a multigenerational living situation loved it and said it was a huge financial relief. Good luck with your multigenerational plans! Short-term Rentals in Stonegate:

Please be advised that Douglas County Zoning does not allow short-term rentals (rentals of less than thirty (30) days) within a residential district. Staff at Douglas County Zoning has confirmed that a residence within a suburban residential district, such as Stonegate Village, being utilized as a short-term rental would be subject to a zoning violation. Complaints alleging short-term rental use within Stonegate can be reported to Zoning compliance, either to the Director Michael Carry or David Clements. Both Michael and David can be reached through the Zoning reception desk at 303-660-7460.

Complaint Procedure

Who May Submit Complaints?

Complaints regarding alleged violations of the Covenants, Design Guidelines or Rules and Regulations may be reported by members of the Board of Directors, members of the Community or the Association's Manager.

How Complaints Should Be Submitted.

Complaints by a member of the community shall be in writing and must include a contact name and email address or phone number in case there is an inquiry from the Board or management office regarding the complaint submitted. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. Your name and contact information will not be provided to the person you have made a complaint about; it is only needed for the management team. The member must have observed the alleged violation and shall contain the nature of the alleged violation, the location of the alleged violation and the date it was observed; photos are very helpful. A complaint may also be submitted by any member of the Board of Directors or by the Association Manager after a walk through or inspection of the Community.

Gardens in Miniature

Have you ever found yourself captivated by a scene, lost in thought—traveling miles in the mind? A miniature garden can provide an unexplored avenue for armchair travel.



Bonsai

Perhaps the most recognizable form of miniature garden is the bonsai, or table-top tree. A Japanese term for "planted in a container," Bon-sai or bonsai involves dwarfing a tree or shrub by pruning of stems and roots and growing in a small container while carefully controlling water and fertilizer. Training a tree from scratch can take years and specially honed skills, but the payoff is worth it. From a single specimen to a tiny forest, a well-crafted bonsai will transport you to windy cliffs, craggy mountains, and mysterious forests. To produce a realistic impression of an aged tree or ancient forest, plants used for bonsai are carefully pruned and trained, and are usually chosen for their small leaves. The easiest bonsai to care for are tropical plants, since they do not require a cold dormant period like trees from temperate regions. If you're ready to give bonsai a try, consider joining the Rocky Mountain Bonsai Society (https://www.rmbonsai.org/) to meet others interested in perfecting the art.

Terrariums

Another way to enjoy another world without leaving home is to craft a terrarium. While specially built glasshouses are available, you can use any container that will function as a tiny greenhouse. A terrarium will allow you to grow plants for tropical locales that require high humidity and are often designed as tiny ecosystems, with many types of plants forming a little slice of the jungle. A terrarium is also a great place to grow carnivorous plants like Venus Flytraps, since their natural habitat of humid bogs is hard to come by in Colorado! Like bonsai from temperate climates, Flytraps require a (mild) winter to thrive over years; consider putting them in a cold room, near a drafty window, or outdoors in early spring (when temperatures are above freezing but still cool) to mimic their natural growing conditions. Tropical plants need no such pampering.



Fairy Gardens

Just about any small garden furnished with the appropriate props can be dubbed a "fairy garden." Most traditionally, fairy gardens, like bonsai, use plants that can give the appearance of great age and distant scale with small leaves and trainable habits, allowing a gardener to create a pint-sized homestead. Hedges, topiary, and trees adorned with treehouses are common sights in the fairy garden. Owing to the extra imagination involved, fairy gardens can be a great project to complete with kids. To keep things from becoming completely zany, consider choosing a theme to help guide plant and prop choices—why not build a leprechaun manor this St. Patrick's Day?

Whatever type of miniature garden you decide to try, remember that the number one cause of plant death indoors in over-watering. Water your plants thoroughly, but then allow the container to dry slightly before watering again (how much precisely to let things dry depends on the plant you're growing). A closed terrarium may require water once or twice a month, while a bonsai may need daily attention. Other considerations include light, temperature, and nutrients (in the form of fertilizer). Choose the right plants for your indoor environment, and then let the armchair adventuring begin!









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GUIDING YOU THROUGH THE STORM!

Hello Stonegate!

Kaler here, your fellow Stonegate Resident & neighborhood Hail Damage Expert! As most of you know, our wonderful community was hit hard last year by multiple devastating hail storms. The hail present in those storms was large enough to cause widespread damage to most roofs, even brand new ones. Did you know damage to your roof from hail can not only lead to roof leaks & interior damages, but can also significantly reduce the longevity of the roofs lifespan if it's not repaired?

Do you know if your home was affected? Have you had a professional contractor check out it? If not, don't fret, there's still time. You have 1 full year from the date of storm to report a claim to insurance if needed. My job is to help guide you through the process to determine if a filling a claim is needed.
