# Watering Restrictions and Guidelines for 2024

The Stonegate Village Metropolitan District (SVMD) manages and oversees the operations and maintenance of the District's water resources and facilities within the Stonegate Village, Stonegate North Villages Metropolitan District and Compark communities. As part of the District's overall water conversation program, SVMD announced watering restrictions and guidelines for District residents. These restrictions and guidelines became effective on April 15, 2019 and will remain in effect until further notice. The District Board Members have kept a close eye on drought conditions and as conditions continue to be warmer and drier than normal, the District Board asks each resident and commercial user to adhere to and participate in the District's water conservation program.

The 2024 SVMD Water Restrictions and Guideline Schedule are listed below:

#### 2024 SVMD Water Restrictions and Guidelines

- Addresses ending with an even number (0, 2, 4, 6 or 8) may water Sundays, Tuesdays, and Fridays.
- Addresses ending with an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7 or 9) may water Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays.
- All other properties (multi-family and commercial) may water on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays.
- No watering is permissible on Wednesdays.
- Watering is permissible before 10 a.m. or after 6 p.m. on your designated watering days.
- A three-week grace period with no watering restrictions is granted for addresses with new lawns, provided the installation occurs prior to Memorial Day or after Labor Day.

Additionally, the District is not only a provider of water but also a user. As a user, the District will support the water conservation efforts by reducing water usage in the open space areas by establishing the following goals and directions:

- Ensure irrigation occurs within agronomic rates.
- Continue to audit the irrigation system and correct deficiencies in a timely manner.
- Identify areas that can be converted to lower-water-use plant materials.
- Maximize the reuse of treated effluent water for parks and recreation areas. Treated effluent which is not used for irrigation would be discharged to Cherry Creek and any opportunity for reuse would be lost.
- Eliminate use of deep ground water supply as a supplemental source to the treated effluent irrigation system.

# Trash Receptacle Reminder

Please remember to secure your lids on your trash cans properly and make sure plastic bags are tied when left for the disposal carrier. On those windy days, your neighbors would prefer not having your trash all over their front yard. Also as a reminder, trash bags/receptacles should not be stored outside of the home prior to trash pick up day. It is also helpful if you bag your trash items and place the bags in the receptacles rather than throwing loose trash into the bins. # RECYCLING GUIDELINES

For the health and safety of our workers, please make sure all recyclable materials in your curbside bins are washed out and clean and follow the below guidelines.

# ACCEPTABLE RECYCLING ITEMS

## 1. What items CAN be recycled?

#### **Paper**

mixed paper | cardboard newspapers, magazines, & catalogs cartons | paperboard phonebooks & paperback books

#### Metals

aluminum cans | foil pie plates | steel cans loose metal jar lids | bottle caps

# **Plastics**

rigid plastic | bottles and containers plastics #1-7, No food residue, plastic bags, Styrofoam or hard plastic items

# Glass

Clean and washed-out glass containers including bottles, jars, etc. No food residue

- Empty and rinse all containers
- Place recyclables loose and unbagged in your recycling container
- Flatten all cardboard and paperboard boxes
- Place your recycling container 4ft from parked cars and other obstacles

## 1. What items CAN NOT be recycled?

Please DO NOT place the following products in your curbside recycling container.

NO GARBAGE | NO PLASTIC BAGS | NO PLASTIC FILM | NO STYROFOAM®

- NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM: We cannot accept plastic bags in your curbside recycling bin. Plastic bags can be recycled at most local grocery stores.
- NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTICS: We accept plastics #1-7 but there are some plastics that are not recyclable. These products include Styrofoam, hard plastic items including toys, plastic chairs, flower pots, PVC pipes and any other plastic products that are not listed in these guidelines.
- NO LIQUIDS OR FOOD RESIDUE: Please completely empty and rinse out all containers before recycling.
- NO CERAMICS OR OTHER GLASS PRODUCTS: Do not place glass, ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, porcelain, or window glass in your curbside recycling container.
- NO SCRAP METAL: No scrap metal items of any size in your curbside recycling container.
- NO ELECTRONICS: Do not place electronic devices in your curbside recycling container.
- NO HAZARDOUS WASTE: We do not accept hazardous waste such as oil-based paint, automotive fluids, car batteries, fertilizers or pesticides. Latex paint recycling locations can be found on PaintCare.org.

Question: With interest rates so high right now, is it better to stay put and upgrade our current home or move?

**Answer:** This question is on the minds of many homeowners right now, and it's a complex one without a universal answer. However, we can offer some considerations to help you think it through.

First and foremost, it's essential to assess whether the proposed home improvement is a sound financial decision. One useful resource for estimating costs and potential added value is the Cost vs. Value report available on remodeling.hw.net. This report breaks down average project costs and their impact on home value.

However, the decision isn't always purely financial. Sometimes, the need for more space is the primary concern. There are various ways to expand, from creative solutions like under-the-stairs offices to more traditional options like finishing a garage. It's important to weigh the potential value added against any drawbacks, such as losing valuable garage space.

Cost considerations are significant, especially with current increases in lumber and labor costs. We are seeing additions cost around \$300 per square foot! While additions can add square footage, buying a larger home is typically the more cost-effective solution.

Unique options like "She Sheds" can provide additional space with style, but it's important to note that these spaces typically can't be counted in your home's square footage, so they don't add much value to the home.

Finishing an attic or repurposing existing storage areas can also be options, though they may come with challenges like heating and cooling issues.

# Dog Barking Reminder!



Dogs left alone all day get bored and restless, and many find relief in barking. Some respond noisily to any and all activity. But, nothing is as annoying as incessant barkingeven for dog lovers. If your dog is a vapper or a vowler, please consider some of these bark-abatement ideas to keep the noise down in your area. Your neighbors will thank you!

- Training. Always the first recommendation for any behavioral problem! Help is as close as the Yellow Pages. Training not only helps your dog, you'll be surprised how much it helps you, too. You may get some insight into why your dog barks so much, or what it is trying to communicate.
- Citronella collars. A humane alternative to the electric-shock, anti-barking collar and costs about the same. Available on the web and in pet stores.
- Confinement. Sometimes simply bringing an outspoken dog indoors or confining it to a crate can cut down on the disturbance to neighbors.
- Reduce stimulus. Close drapes to help muffle street noise, or leave a radio on to mask it. Disconnect telephones and doorbells before leaving your home if they upset your dog or make it bark.
- Companionship. Dogs are pack animals; they need companionship—a cat, bird, or another dog. Consider a midday visit from a pet-sitting service, or drop your pooch off at a friend's place or a day-care facility once or twice a week.



# Bee Happy: Why Attracting Pollinators to Your Garden Benefits Everyone

Bees, butterflies, birds, and . . . bats? What do they have in common and why do we need them? They all help our planet through pollination and ensure that crops get fertilized, so they can grow and provide us with food. Pollinators go from flower to flower on the hunt for pollen and nectar. Pollen from the plants then gets attached to their bodies as they fly or crawl on the flowers, or reach into the blooms for nectar. They carry that pollen to the next flower, where some of it falls off – allowing fertilization to occur so the plant can reproduce and create seeds, berries, fruits, vegetables, and new plants.



Bees are the pollinators we think of most, but butterflies, moths, wasps, flies, beetles, birds, and even bats, are pollinators. Pollinators are prolific in terms of how many plants they frequent a day – the totals are astounding. Most bee species generally visit around 1,500 flowers per day, and a single bee colony can pollinate 300 million flowers in one day! Some hummingbird species visit upwards of 2,000 flowers daily. However you look at it, that's a lot of pollination going on!

Unfortunately, our pollinators are in trouble and in decline worldwide, due in large part to loss of habitat, invasive species (looking at you, murder hornet!), parasites, climate change, extreme weather, and the use of pesticides. What can we do to help? We can create pollinator-friendly environments that meet their needs – specifically food, water, and shelter.

**FOOD** – Plant flowering species so that pollinators will have food in the spring, summer, and fall. Plant as many flowers as you can, including different colors, shapes, and varieties to entice those pollinators to your garden. Spring in Colorado is a great time to introduce pollinator-friendly plants to your landscape.

Consider **shrubs** such as serviceberry, chokecherry, and butterfly bush. **Perennials** include columbine, coneflower, blanket flower, wild bergamot, wood rose, rabbitbrush, yarrow, blue flax, salvia, catmint, and many more. Other plants with appealing blooms are borage, dahlia, daisy, goldenrod, and snapdragon. Even flowering weeds can be food sources. If possible, plant in groups. Clumps of flowers will draw more insects and birds than single plants scattered around your property. Place your plants together based on their water needs so they will have the best chance for successful growth.

Don't forget about plants for the hummingbirds! With their long narrow beaks and tube-like tongues for drinking nectar, they love the similarly-shaped blooms of agastache, penstemon, trumpet vine, red hot poker, bee balm, and columbine.

No yard or limited space for plants? **Container plants and annuals** look beautiful in your yard, on a patio or balcony, plus provide plenty of blooms for bees, butterflies and more. Options abound, including lavender, rudbeckia, dill, zinnia, lantana, sweet alyssum, geraniums, cosmos, verbena, and marigold.

**WATER** – Offer a water source for drinking. All insects and birds need access to water. Consider a shallow bird bath in your yard. Even a saucer of water placed on the ground or in a flowerbed will do.



Adding a few pebbles or rocks at or above the water surface will give insects a safe place to perch while drinking. Check the water level frequently, particularly during those summer days with extremely hot temperatures. You are not only providing a



reliable water source and necessary hydration for pollinators, but also adding a beautiful feature to your landscape at the same time.

**SHELTER** – Create housing for these pollinators, who need nesting sites to rear their young and places to take cover from predators. Just leaving the stalks of some hollow-stemmed plants over the winter is extremely valuable to stem-nesting bees – they can shelter inside these tubes and in the spring, nest, and lay eggs there. Insects also use dead wood, rock walls, and burrows in bare earth for their shelters. Other options are small pre-made or homemade bee boxes. (Steer clear of butterfly houses, though—butterflies don't use them!). Trees offer nesting sites for insects and birds as well.

When we purposely create a suitable and sustainable habitat for pollinators and meet their needs, we are providing for their future, and in turn, ours. We would be hard-pressed to get our agricultural crops fertilized without them. Plant species could not reproduce, would decline, and eventually disappear — a terrifying thought. We owe a great deal of thanks to all of these hard-working pollinators and must do our best to help them in return.

# **Update: Fence Staining Project**


