Safeguard Your Drinking Water!

Think Before You Flush! Flushing unused or expired medicines can be harmful to your drinking water. Properly disposing of unused or expired medication helps protect you and the environment. Count on Us! Delivering high-quality drinking water to our customers involves far more than just pushing water through pipes. Water treatment is a complex, time-consuming process. Because tap water is highly regulated by state and federal laws, water treatment plant and system operators must be licensed and are required to commit to long-term, on-the-job training before becoming fully qualified. Our licensed water professionals have a basic understanding of a wide range of subjects, including mathematics, biology, chemistry, and physics. Some of the tasks they complete on a regular basis include:

- Operating and maintaining equipment to purify and clarify water.
- Monitoring and inspecting machinery, meters, gauges, and operating conditions.
- Conducting tests and inspections on water and evaluating the results.
- Maintaining optimal water chemistry.
- Applying data to formulas that determine treatment requirements, flow levels, and concentration levels.
- Documenting and reporting test results and system operations to regulatory agencies.

So, the next time you turn on your faucet, think of the skilled professionals who stand behind each drop.

Water Conservation Tips! You can play a role in conserving water and saving yourself money in the process. It is not hard to conserve water. Here are a few tips:

- Automatic dishwashers use 15 gallons for every cycle, regardless of how many dishes are loaded. Save money and load it to capacity.
- Turn off the tap when brushing your teeth.
- Check every faucet in your home for leaks. Just a slow drip can waste 15 to 20 gallons a day. Fix it and save 6,000 gallons per year.
- Check your toilets for leaks by putting a few drops of food coloring in the tank. Watch for a few minutes to see if the color shows up in the bowl. It is not uncommon to lose up to 100 gallons/day from an invisible toilet leak. Fix it and save more than 30,000 gallons a year.
- Use your water meter to detect hidden leaks. Simply turn off all taps and water using appliances. Then check the meter after 15 minutes. If it moved, you have a leak.



Complaint Procedure

Who May Submit Complaints? Complaints regarding alleged violations of the Covenants, Design Guidelines or Rules and Regulations may be reported by members of the Board of Directors, members of the Community or the Association's Manager.

How Complaints Should Be Submitted. Complaints by a member of the community shall be in writing and must include a contact name and email address or phone number in case there is an inquiry from the Board or management office regarding the complaint submitted. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. Your name and contact information will not be provided to the person you have made a complaint about; it is only needed for the management team. The member must have observed the alleged violation and shall contain the nature of the alleged violation, the location of the alleged violation and the date it was observed. Photos are very helpful. A complaint may also be submitted by any member of the Board of Directors or by the Association Manager after a walk through or inspection of the Community. You may send your concerns to PCMS via email at support@pcms.net or via fax at 303-224-0002.

Trash Receptacle Reminder

Please remember to secure your lids on your trash cans properly and make sure plastic bags are tied when left for the disposal carrier. On those windy days, your neighbors would prefer not having your trash all over their front yard. Also as a reminder, trash bags/receptacles should not be stored outside of the home prior to trash pick-up day. It is also helpful if you bag your trash items and place the bags in the receptacles rather than throwing loose trash into the bins. Our trash service provider has been instructed to leave the trash receptacles on the curb rather than on the right of way sidewalk after it has been picked up. Thanks!



APPLICATION REVIEW PROCEDURE Modifications Committee (MC)

In order to try to improve the current homeowner design review request submittal procedure, our MC has established a process for the receipt, review and response of all future design review requests. The MC will schedule and convene meetings as necessary to review homeowner applications submitted to the management company, PCMS, based upon the following schedule: a) owner applications with all required additional documentation received by the first Friday of the month will be reviewed by the MC for response to the owner by the third Friday of the month; b) owner applications with all required additional documentation received by the third Friday of the month will be reviewed by the MC for response to the owner by the first Friday of the month. These schedules are subject to change by the MC.

1. What items CAN NOT be recycled?

- Please DO NOT place the following products in your curbside recycling container. NO GARBAGE | NO PLASTIC BAGS | NO PLASTIC FILM | NO STYROFOAM®
- NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM: We cannot accept plastic bags in your curbside recycling bin. Plastic bags can be recycled at most local grocery stores.
- NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTICS: We accept plastics #1-7 but there are some plastics that are not recyclable. These products include Styrofoam, hard plastic items including toys, plastic chairs, flower pots, PVC pipes and any other plastic products that are not listed in these guidelines.
- NO LIQUIDS OR FOOD RESIDUE: Please completely empty and rinse out all containers before recycling
- NO CERAMICS OR OTHER GLASS PRODUCTS: Do not place glass, ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, porcelain, or window glass in your curbside recycling container.
- NO SCRAP METAL: No scrap metal items of any size in your curbside recycling container.
- NO ELECTRONICS: Do not place electronic devices in your curbside recycling container.
- NO HAZARDOUS WASTE: We do not accept hazardous waste such as oil-based paint, automotive fluids, car batteries, fertilizers or pesticides. Latex paint recycling locations can be found on PaintCare.org.

Question: My driveway and steps are falling apart. What should I do?

Answer: As summer heats up, many of us are diving into home improvement projects. While it's a season for relaxation and fun, our homes often demand attention, especially when it comes to our concrete surfaces. During the garage sale visits, I was reminded of the challenges Stonegate faces with its expansive soils, which can cause significant damage to concrete over time. From minor cracks to more serious issues like sloping and crumbling, our concrete can deteriorate in various ways. To tackle these issues proactively, I recommend using Sikaflex, a product available at home improvement stores, to fill cracks as they appear. Dog Barking Reminder!



Dogs left alone all day get bored and restless, and many find relief in barking. Some respond noisily to any and all activity. But, nothing is as annoying as incessant barking even for dog lovers. If your dog is a yapper or a yowler, please consider some of these bark-abatement ideas to keep the noise down in your area. Your neighbors will thank you!

- **Training.** Always the first recommendation for any behavioral problem! Help is as close as the Yellow Pages. Training not only helps your dog, you'll be surprised how much it helps you, too. You may get some insight into why your dog barks so much, or what it is trying to communicate.
- **Citronella collars.** A humane alternative to the electric-shock, anti-barking collar and costs about the same. Available on the web and in pet stores.
- **Confinement.** Sometimes simply bringing an outspoken dog indoors or confining it to a crate can cut down on the disturbance to neighbors.
- Reduce stimulus. Close drapes to help muffle street noise, or leave a radio on to mask it. Disconnect telephones and doorbells before leaving your home if they upset your dog or make it bark.
- **Companionship.** Dogs are pack animals; they need companionship—a cat, bird, or another dog. Consider a midday visit from a pet-sitting service, or drop your pooch off at a friend's place or a day-care facility once or twice a week.



Protecting your Garden from Colorado's Extreme Summer Weather

What can you do to give your flowers and veggies a fighting chance?

When we think of the most destructive summer weather conditions in Colorado, a pounding hail often comes to mind. Our state also receives its share of high temperatures and scorching sun, along with harsh winds and heavy rains. The devastation from recent storms has shown us that Mother Nature is not fooling around. Even one of these weather events has the potential to destroy your summer garden in one fell swoop.

Having a plan to protect your plants can lessen the panic of running outside at the last minute and throwing whatever you can over your precious vegetation. You may already have a few items on hand that would be helpful when faced with an oncoming storm. Here are some tips to help you prepare.



Hail Protection:

Use overturned **plastic pots or buckets** to cover your smaller plants. Weigh them down with a brick or heavy rocks. Set these up when hail is expected, to block heavy rains from damaging plants or drowning their roots, and/or to protect tender growth from punishing winds.

Tomato cages provide a great framework from which to attach a tarp or other covering to deter hail. Use zip ties or clamps to attach. Another option is to wire a sheet of small gauge hardware

cloth across the top of the cages, if larger hail is expected. Voila – tomatoes covered!



Keep a **few tarps** on hand for quick hail protection of berry bushes, small fruit trees, or other areas of your garden. Remember to use support underneath if covering tender plantings, so they won't get crushed.

Grow your flowers or veggies in **movable containers**. They can be quickly relocated onto a covered patio, under a deck or inside a garage if hail is expected.

Sun and Heat Protection:

Hoop tunnels already being used for your in-ground garden are readymade sun shelters, and they are also ideal for covering raised beds.

Shade cloth and **row covers** provide other options to lessen harsh sun. Their permeable fabrics filter sunlight but still allow moisture to get to the ground. Do not use plastic coverings, as they have the opposite effect and will bake your plants!

Container gardens let you control the amount of sunlight they receive, and can be moved into shade (or under cover during hail or rainstorms).

Consider **companion planting**, where you place taller plants in areas of your garden where they can naturally shade their shorter neighbors.



Heavy Rains:

Soil: Make sure your soil is not compacted so that water is not just sitting on top; use a hoe or pitchfork to loosen it regularly. Consider amending your existing soil by adding organic matter like compost or manure. Doing so creates air pockets in the soil that will allow more drainage.

Cover tender plants and seedlings with **pots and buckets** to prevent excessive moisture from pooling around the bases of plants and their roots.

Mulches: Straw or other organic mulches will stop exposed soils from getting either too compacted from the rain, or from eroding. Without mulch, the top layer of your soil could literally wash away. A mulch will also shield the plant roots from excessive rain.

Raised beds are beneficial, especially for wet areas that get a lot of rainfall. Delicate plants such as tomatoes are better protected in a raised bed where their elevated roots will not get flooded.

High Winds:

If high winds or related wind-damaging weather are in the forecast, relocate your containers and hanging baskets to areas under shelter where they cannot be blown away or broken apart. Take off your shade structures and hoop tunnels, and store elsewhere.



Remember that taller plants are more susceptible to breakage or uprooting from high winds, so support these well, wrapping in burlap and binding with twine to a stake or trellis set firmly in the ground. This includes larger plants and shrubs which have weaker branch structures than trees.

Consider pruning and removing any dead or damaged tree branches well before an oncoming wind storm. This will help prevent these branches from falling and causing further damage to the tree itself or structures near it.

Utilize man-made and natural wind barriers around your garden beds. These can anything that will block or lessen the wind. A fence, trellis, or some heavy bags of soil, rocks, or sand would work.

Mulch can be used as barrier against strong winds too. With a thick enough application, it can cover and guard the roots of plants from potential damage.

Preparation Is Key

As we all know, the weather in Colorado can change quickly. You can reduce the risk of damage before bad weather sets in by securing loose objects, reinforcing plant coverings and structures, preparing soils, and inspecting your garden for potential hazards. After a storm, assess any damage so you will be ready for the next one. A few minutes of preparation may be the key to preventing excessive harm to your plants and preserving your beautiful garden.

Pool Parties at the District's Family Pool

The district's new reservation process allows residents of both Stonegate North Villages and Stonegate Village Metropolitan District to hold pool parties at the Family Pool.

• The cost of the facility is set at \$50 per hour. Those who reserve will have access to the courtyard at the Community Center during their event.

• Lifeguards will need to be reserved and paid for during the reservation process as well. The cost is \$40 per hour, per lifeguard, based on the number of people. Infants and non-swimmers need to be included in the headcount.

• If the pool party is held during normal pool hours, then one guard is required for every 25 people attending. For example, 1 to 25 people requires a per hour charge for one guard and 26 to 50 people requires a per hour charge for two guards.

• If the pool party is held outside of normal pool hours then a minimum per hour charge for two lifeguards is required regardless of the number of people.

As a reminder, all the following District recreational spaces and facilities now require a reservation:

- the Community Center
- the Community Center with Access to the Family Pool
- the Family Pool for Pool Parties
- the Park Pavilion
- the Stonegate North Villages Open Space

To initiate a reservation request, visit the Make a **Reservation** tab under the Recreation and Facilities tab of the website.


