

Porch Lights Aglow

The long winter nights and short winter days are upon us again. The long dark nights are the perfect opportunity for the criminal element to strike. The best way to prevent criminal activity is to keep the area well lit. If you are worried about cost, don't be too concerned. Studies show the demand is low at that time of day, so there is only a nominal cost. That makes the porch light a relatively inexpensive way to protect your valuables. There is much more expensive crime fighting equipment out there, but the police even suggest that leaving your light on is the best deterrent to a would be criminal. For the best savings, use a 40 watt, 130 volt bulb. Light also prevents accidents.

Trash Removal Reminder:

The Association has received concerns regarding owners that are either placing their trash out too early and/or owners that do not have their trash properly contained and are placing their trash receptacle and/or bags on the right-of-way sidewalk. As a reminder, all trash bags need to be properly tied and all trash cans should have a lid to help eliminate blowing debris and animal access. 




Complaint Procedure

Who May Submit Complaints? Complaints regarding alleged violations of the Covenants, Design Guidelines or Rules and Regulations may be reported by members of the Board of Directors, members of the Community or the Association's Manager.

How Complaints Should be Submitted: Complaints by a member of the community shall be in writing and must include a contact name and email address or phone number in case there is an inquiry from the Board or management office regarding the complaint submitted. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. Your name and contact information will not be provided to the person you have made a complaint about; it is only needed for the management team. The member must have observed the alleged violation and shall contain the nature of the alleged violation, the location of the alleged violation and the date it was observed, photos are very helpful. A complaint may also be submitted by any member of the Board of Directors or by the Association Manager after a walk through or inspection of the Community. - 2. Start seeds of native or adapted plants outdoors, either in pots or directly planted in the garden.
- 3. Water trees and shrubs if temperatures are above 40F and the soil is dry. Aim to wet the area deeply over a few hours with a slow soak.
- 4. Check houseplants for pests and disease.

February

- 1. Look in garden beds (yours or others!) for early bulbs like snowdrops, crocus, and snow buttercups, and winter-flowering perennials like hellebores.
- 2. Water trees and shrubs if temperatures are above 40F and the soil is dry.
- 3. In garden beds where early-flowering plants like tulips or daffodils are planted, clean up garden debris and complete cutting back dead perennials to highlight the fresh growth.
- 4. Prune shrubs and trees as needed (avoiding spring "bleeders" and those that flower on old wood, like lilacs.

March

- 1. Finish cleaning up annual and vegetable
- 2. Consider moving certain houseplants outdoors during warm days-but don't forget to bring them back inside at night!
- Start warm season plants like eggplant and peppers from seed indoors.

April

- Start tomatoes and warm-season flowers like petunias from seed indoors.
- Plant cool-season vegetables like radishes, peas, beets, and greens outdoors.
- Check for early season weeds like henbit, cheeseweed, and cheatgrass. Many could already be flowering! (Admire them before tossing!)
- Plant hardened spring annuals and perennials (those acclimated to cold temperatures). Begin to divide perennial grasses and summer-blooming perennials when they begin to push green growth, as needed.

May

- Plant warm-season annuals and vegetables after your area's last frost date.
- Divide and pot-up houseplants. Move 2. some to "summer homes" outside.
- Fertilize house plants and outdoor planters.
- Deadhead bulbs and spring-flowering plants but let the foliage die down naturally.
- 5. Scout outdoor plantings and the vegetable garden for early signs of pest and disease. Look closely for aphids and squash bugs!

- Pinch back perennials like black-eyedsusans and asters for denser growth and lengthened flowering season.
- Fertilize house plants.
- Prune spring-flowering shrubs like lilacs once flowering is complete.
- Continue to scout gardens for early signs of pests and disease—catching things early really helps!

Yuly

- Remove the spent flowers from perennials to improve appearance and promote prolonged flowering.
- 2. Fertilize outdoor planters; remove spent flowers regularly.
- Harvest vegetables as they ripen. 3.
- Divide irises once they're done flowering (around the 4th of July)

- **August**1. Plant fall crops like greens and radishes; harvest crops as they ripen.
- Cut back dead stems and spent flowers from perennials; trim back unruly herbs.
- Divide houseplants—consider which ones you can propagate and give as gifts!
- 4. Finish pruning trees and shrubs before night temperatures begin to decline.

September

- 1. Harvest vegetables, and continue to deadhead annuals and perennials.
- Prepare frost protection, which will be 2. needed soon! Bring over-summering house plants back indoors.
- Don't prune unless absolutely necessary (to correct damage, for example)late pruning can delay trees entering dormancy, making them more susceptible to damage from cold temperatures.
- Plant new perennials and water them thoroughly. Divide spring-flowering perennials no later than this month.

October

- 1. Clean up dead annuals, vegetables, and containers after first frost.
- Plant bulbs—be sure to water them well!
- Remove leaves from the lawn (or mow them into the lawn); consider keeping disease-free leaves as mulch in perennial beds or around trees and shrubs.

November

- Plant indoor bulbs like amaryllis for blooms 1. by late December.
- 2. Wrap young trees with paper tree wrap from ground level to the lowest branches.
- Refresh wood chip mulch in perennial beds and around trees and shrubs.

December

- 1. Cut back perennials as they become unsightly.
- Water trees and shrubs if temperatures are 2. above 40F and the soil is dry.
- Make wreaths with evergreen trimmings.

Christmas-December 25th Falls on a Thursday service starts Friday

RECYCLING GUIDELINES: For the health and safety of our workers, please make sure all recyclable materials in your curbside bins are washed out and clean and follow the below guidelines.

- Empty and rinse all containers
- Place recyclables loose and unbagged in your curbside recycling container
- Flatten all cardboard/paperboard boxes
- Place your recycling container 4ft from parked cars and other obstacles

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: What items CAN be recycled?

Paper: mixed paper | newspapers, magazines, catalogs | cardboard | cartons | paperboard | phonebooks & paperback books

Plastics: Clean and rinsed out rigid plastic bottles and containers | No food residue No plastic bags | No Styrofoam | No hard plastic items

Metals: aluminum cans, foil, pie plates | steel cans | loose metal jar lids & bottle caps

Glass: Clean and washed out glass in your curbside recycling bin | No food residue

NOT ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: What items CAN NOT be recycled?

NO GARBAGE | NO STYROFOAM® | NO ELECTRONICS | NO SCRAP METAL

NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM: We cannot accept plastic bags. Plastic bags can be recycled at most local grocery stores. NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTICS: We accept plastics #1-7. Some plastics that are not recyclable: Styrofoam, hard plastic items including toys, plastic chairs, flower pots, PVC pipes & any other plastics that are not listed in these guidelines.

NO LIQUIDS OR FOOD RESIDUE: Please completely empty and rinse out all containers.

NO CERAMICS OR OTHER GLASS PRODUCTS: Do not place glass, ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, porcelain, or window glass in your recycling container.

NO HAZARDOUS WASTE: No hazardous waste such as oil-based paint, automotive fluids, car batteries, fertilizers or pesticides. Latex paint recycling locations can be found on PaintCare.org.
