Town of Castle Rock Municipal Code: Leeding Wildlife

The Town of Castle Rock as well as State law prohibits the feeding of wild animals, except for certain types of birds. The Animal Control Officers can be a good resource for you. Please see below for additional information.

Town of castle Rock Municipal Code

6.02.030 Definitions

Wild animal shall mean all wildlife, including, but not limited to, bears, coyotes, foxes, mountain lions, opossums, raccoons, skunks, squirrels, raptors, all game animals, and all other species of animals, which exist in their natural, unconfined state and are usually not domesticated.

6.02.310 - Feeding of wild animals prohibited.

A. It is unlawful for any person to feed, provide, leave, distribute or scatter attractants in a manner in which any wild animal would reasonably be able to gain access to such attractant or which might entice any wild animal within the Town.

B. This Section shall not apply to any person utilizing a bird feeder, provided that the feeder is elevated or suspended on a pole, (e.g. shepherd's pole), cable or other similar device to make it inaccessible to wild animals and the area below the feeder is kept free from the accumulation of seeds and seed debris and waste debris.

C. It is unlawful for any person to dispense, feed of otherwise make available to any birds, either on such person's property, or on the property of another, or of the Town any type or amount of food in a manner that:

- 1. Creates an unclean, unsafe or unsanitary condition either on such person's property or on the property of another or of the Town.
- 2. Results in the accumulation of droppings, feces, or feathers either on such person's property or on the property of another or of the Town.
- 3. Creates an unreasonable disturbance either on such person's property or on the property of another or of the Town.
- 4. Attracts other wildlife, vermin, or pests either to such person's property or the property of another or of the Town.
- 5. Otherwise deleteriously affects the quiet enjoyment by others of any private or public property.

What items CAN NOT be recycled?

Please DO NOT place the following products in your curbside recycling container. NO GARBAGE | NO PLASTIC BAGS | NO PLASTIC FILM | NO STYROFOAM®

NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM: We cannot accept plastic bags in your curbside recycling bin. Plastic bags can be recycled at most local grocery stores.

NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTICS: We accept plastics #1-7 but there are some plastics that are not recyclable. These products include Styrofoam, hard plastic items including toys, plastic chairs, flower pots, PVC pipes and any other plastic products that are not listed in these guidelines.

NO LIQUIDS OR FOOD RESIDUE: Please completely empty and rinse out all containers before recycling.

NO CERAMICS OR OTHER GLASS PRODUCTS: Do not place glass, ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, porcelain, or window glass in your curbside recycling container.

NO SCRAP METAL: Do not place scrap metal items of any size in your curbside recycling container.

NO ELECTRONICS: Do not place electronic devices in your curbside recycling container.

Complaint Procedure

Who May Submit Complaints? Complaints regarding alleged violations of the Covenants, Design Guidelines or Rules and Regulations may be reported by members of the Board of Directors, members of the Community or the Association's Manager.

Microgreens: Iriend or Iad? A New Year's Growing Irend

As winter plods on, planting something to beat the winter blues is an attractive idea. Many of us are thinking about fresh ways to bring vegetables into our lives, though outdoor vegetable gardening is a few months away. Enter microgreens: tiny, nutrient-packed plants that promise big rewards in a short time. Are they a passing trend, or here to stay? Let's explore.

What Are Microgreens?

Microgreens are small, edible plants harvested at a early stage of growth. They are slightly larger than sprouts but should not be confused with them. These little greens include a variety of vegetables such as mustard, radish, basil, Swiss chard, kale, cabbage, arugula, and cress. There are also specially designed blends tailored to top sandwiches or salads. One of the best things about microgreens is how quickly they grow. From seed to harvest, the whole process takes just 10 days. For those new to gardening, especially kids, growing microgreens is an exciting activity. Why Grow Microgreens?

Microgreens are rarely sold in grocery stores and when they are, they are expensive due to fragility of the product and packaging required. Microgreens grow incredibly fast, providing a fast payoff in the doldrums of winter. Plus, they are nutritional powerhouses containing vitamins A, B, and C and antioxidants.

How to Grow Microgreens:

Seeds can be procured at your local garden center. I have recently tried cilantro microgreens and the Jazzy Mix offered by Botanical Interests®. For step-by-step directions with pictures, visit An Edible Project for Winter Green Thumbs – Pueblo County Extension.

Growing microgreens is easy and doesn't require much space. Here's a simple step-by-step guide to get you started:

- 1. Procure Seed Starting Mix or Potting Mix Start by moistening the mix.
- 2. **Fill a Container** You can use a six-pack from your local nursery or even clear to-go containers with lids. Anything that can hold the mix and allow for drainage works.
- 3. Sow the Seeds Sprinkle the seeds generously over the soil.
- **4.** Water Use a spray bottle to moisten the soil.
- **5. Cover** Place foil or a lid over the container to block light for the first day. This encourages leggy plants that will reach for the light, making them easier to harvest.
- 6. Light Exposure On day two or three, move the container to a sunny window or under grow lights.
- 7. Harvest Once the first true leaves appear (after the cotyledons, baby leaves), it's time to harvest. Snip off the greens with clean scissors just above the soil level.

How to Harvest and Store Microgreens:

Once your microgreens are ready, use clean scissors to trim them just above the soil level. Be sure to harvest them fresh, as their shelf life is short. If you're not using them right away, store them in a container lined with a paper towel in the fridge. They'll stay fresh for about 3-5 days if kept cool and dry. Wash before eating.
