Microgreens: Iriend or Iad? A New Year's Growing Irend

As winter plods on, planting something to beat the winter blues is an attractive idea. Many of us are thinking about fresh ways to bring vegetables

into our lives, though outdoor vegetable gardening is a few months away. Enter microgreens: tiny, nutrient-packed plants that promise big rewards in a short time. Are they a passing trend, or here to stay? Let's explore.



What Are Microgreens?

Microgreens are small, edible plants harvested at a early stage of growth. They are slightly larger than sprouts but should not be confused with them. These little greens include a variety of vegetables such as mustard, radish, basil, Swiss chard, kale, cabbage, arugula, and cress. There are also specially designed blends tailored to top sandwiches or salads.

One of the best things about microgreens is how quickly they grow. From seed to harvest, the whole process takes just 10 days. For those new to gardening, especially kids, growing microgreens is an exciting activity. Watching the plants grow so quickly can inspire young gardeners and teach them about the cycle of plant life—right in the comfort of home.

Why Grow Microgreens?

Microgreens are rarely sold in grocery stores and when they are, they are expensive due to fragility of the product and packaging required. Microgreens grow incredibly fast, providing a fast payoff in the doldrums of winter. Plus, they are nutritional powerhouses containing vitamins A, B, and C and antioxidants.

How to Grow Microgreens

Seeds can be procured at your local garden center. I have recently tried cilantro microgreens and the Jazzy Mix offered by Botanical Interests[®]. For step-by-step directions with pictures, visit An Edible Project for Winter Green Thumbs – Pueblo County Extension.

Growing microgreens is easy and doesn't require much space. Here's a simple step-by-step guide to get you started:

- 1. Procure Seed Starting Mix or Potting Mix Start by moistening the mix.
- 2. Fill a Container You can use a six-pack from your local nursery or even clear to-go containers with lids. Anything that can hold the mix and allow for drainage works.
- 3. Sow the Seeds Sprinkle the seeds generously over the soil.

- 4. Water Use a spray bottle to moisten the soil.
- 5. Cover Place foil or a lid over the container to block light for the first day. This encourages leggy plants that will reach for the light, making them easier to harvest.
- 6. Light Exposure On day two or three, move the container to a sunny window or under grow lights.
- 7. Harvest Once the first true leaves appear (after the cotyledons, baby leaves), it's time to harvest. Snip off the greens with clean scissors just above the soil level.

How to Harvest and Store Microgreens

Once your microgreens are ready, use clean scissors to trim them just above the soil level. Be sure to harvest them fresh, as their shelf life is short. If you're not using them right away, store them in a container lined with a paper towel in the fridge. They'll stay fresh for about 3-5 days if kept cool and dry. Wash before eating.

Dog Barking Reminder!



Dogs left alone all day get bored and restless, and many find relief in barking. Some respond noisily to any and all activity. But, nothing is as annoying as incessant barking even for dog lovers. If your dog is a yapper or a yowler, please consider some of these bark-abatement ideas to keep the noise down in your area. Your neighbors will thank you!

- **Training.** Always the first recommendation for any behavioral problem! Help is as close as the Yellow Pages. Training not only helps your dog, but you'll be surprised how much it helps you, too. You may get some insight into why your dog barks so much, or what it is trying to communicate.
- **Citronella collars.** A humane alternative to the electric-shock, anti-barking collar and costs about the same. Available on the web and in pet stores.
- **Confinement.** Sometimes simply bringing an outspoken dog indoors or confining it to a crate can cut down on the disturbance to neighbors.
- Reduce stimulus. Close drapes to help muffle street noise, or leave a radio on to mask it. Disconnect telephones and doorbells before leaving your home if they upset your dog or make it bark.
- **Companionship.** Dogs are pack animals; they need companionship—a cat, bird, or another dog. Consider a midday visit from a pet-sitting service, or drop your pooch off at a friend's place or a day-care facility once or twice a week.

Complaint Procedure

Who May Submit Complaints? Complaints regarding alleged violations of the Covenants, Design Guidelines or Rules and Regulations may be reported by members of the Board of Directors, members of the Community or the Association's Manager.

How Complaints Should Be Submitted. Complaints by a member of the community shall be in writing and must include a contact name and email address or phone number in case there is an inquiry from the Board or management office regarding the complaint submitted. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. Your name and contact information will not be provided to the person you have made a complaint about; it is only needed for the management team. The member must have observed the alleged violation and shall contain the nature of the alleged violation, the location of the alleged violation and the date it was observed. Photos are very helpful. A complaint may also be submitted by any member of the Board of Directors or by the Association Manager after a walk through or inspection of the Community. Question: When is the best time of year to sell a Stonegate home?

Answer: The short answer is NOW, but it can be more complex than that. Traditionally, the Stonegate market starts picking up in the middle of February and stays hot till the end of May. However, last year, we saw the market begin to take off much earlier and drop off in early May. We were already seeing bidding wars on homes in the first few weeks of January; so far this year that has not been the case. Interest rates leveled out and even dropped a bit in mid-January. This should stimulate the spring housing market. Most economists think the housing market will stay relatively flat this year, with less than 3% appreciation predicted. Historically, we see most of the yearly appreciation between February and May. If you are thinking of selling in 2023, now is the time to start working on it. Who Is Cupid?

Cupid is often portrayed on Valentine's Day cards as a naked cherub launching arrows of love at unsuspecting lovers. But the Roman God Cupid has his roots in Greek mythology as the Greek god of love, Eros. Accounts of his birth vary; some say he is the son of Nyx and Erebus; others, of Aphrodite and Ares; still others suggest he is the son of Iris and Zephyrus or even Aphrodite and Zeus (who would have been both his father and grandfather).

According to the Greek Archaic poets, Eros was a handsome immortal who played with the emotions of Gods and men, using golden arrows to incite love and leaden ones to sow aversion. It wasn't until the Hellenistic period that he began to be portrayed as the mischievous, chubby child he'd become on Valentine's Day cards.

THE STONEGATE NORTH VILLAGES METROPOLITAN DISTRICT Community Center

The Community Center has become a well-loved part of the metropolitan district since its Grand Opening and launch in late 2023. In 2024 alone, we hosted more than 109 events at the facility — ranging from sports team gatherings, birthday parties, bridal parties and even some weddings! We love that this is a place where residents can bring people together, celebrate special occasions, and make memories that last a lifetime.

As we embark on the 2025 rental season, we wanted to remind people how we work with residents on renting the space and ensure people know where they can find additional information.

Who Can Rent

The facility can be rented by both the residents of Stonegate North Villages Metropolitan District as well as by Stonegate Village Metropolitan District, provided the individual renting has an active VIZpin Mobile Access Pass.

VIZpin Mobile Access Pass

Residents must have an active VIZpin Mobile Access Pass in order to rent the space. If you need to sign up for your VIZpin you can visit the website, go to the Recreation & Facilities tab, and then select Apply for A Pass from the drop-down menu. VIZpin is such a critical part of the community, allowing you to access the Family Pool, Adult Pool & Spa, and other recreational facilities, so don't delay in sending in your application if are new to the community or don't yet have one.

To Check if Dates Are Available or Make A Reservation

We are not able to personally check which dates are available to rent the Community Center, but you can visit the Make A Reservation page and use the links there to check if your dates are available and open. From this page you can also explore booking a pool party at the Family Pool, or renting the Open Space or the Park Pavilion for events.

Community Center Rental Cost

Community Center rentals include the entirety of the Community Center but not the pool facilities. If you are interested in having access to the pool a separate reservation must be made. Residents will be charged \$75 an hour and there is a two-hour minimum required for every reservation. This information is also available on the website.

Tours and Understanding the Space

We do not have staff available to do tours of the space, but we do offer a lot of detail on the website, including photographs. In addition, the building was designed with a "fishbowl" approach, meaning it has floor-to-ceiling windows that allow you to see the spaces available from the front doors. Please feel free to drive by and you will be able to see the expansive Main Hall and the kitchen and get a good sense for if it is a fit for your event. And, of course, the photos on the website and descriptions there will also help. Just visit the website and go to the Recreation & Facilities tab, then select Community Center from the drop-down menu to see the photos.

Tables and Chairs

One of the most frequently asked questions is whether we have tables and chairs available for events. We do! The storage closet will have six eight-foot-long white banquet tables and 80 plastic folding chairs available for you to use for your event. If you need more than this, we ask that you reach out to a rental company to arrange for that. We also do not supply linens.

Hours Available to Rent

The Community Center is available Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. Reservation requests must include all time for set-up, clean-up and tear-down. You will be required to do a pre-event walkthrough with the Community Center Liaison and to meet the Liaison at the conclusion of the rental.

A quick reminder of our snow policies as we enter some of the snowiest months of the year. The district has a contract with a service provider to clear all right-of-way sidewalks on, or adjacent to, common tracts owned by the district. They also clear the main park sidewalks and manage snow removal for the two parking lots adjacent to the Community Center, pool and tennis courts, as well as the park at the southeast corner of Keystone Boulevard and Aventerra Parkway.

Snow removal operations are triggered anytime there is an accumulation of more than two inches in depth. Additionally, the district's contract calls for their teams to begin snow removal operations within twelve hours after snowfall has ceased, or as conditions safely permit. It is important to note that snow removal on the adjacent public streets throughout the district are maintained by Douglas County.

White Chicken Chili

Ingredients

- 1 lb boneless skinless chicken breasts
- 1 yellow onion diced
- 2 cloves garlic minced
- 24 oz. chicken broth
- 2 15oz cans great Northern beans drained and rinsed
- 2 4 oz cans diced green chiles (I do one hot, one mild)
- 1/2 tsp black pepper
- 1 tsp cumin

1 tsp salt

- 3/4 tsp oregano
- 1/2 tsp chili powder
- 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper
- small handful fresh cilantro chopped
 - 4 oz cream cheese softened
- 1 12oz bag frozen whole kernel corn

Instructions

- Add chicken breasts to bottom of slow cooker, top with salt, pepper, cumin, oregano, chili powder, and cayenne pepper.
- Top with diced onion, minced garlic, great Northern beans, green chiles, corn, chicken broth and cilantro. Stir.
- Cover and cook on LOW for 8 hours or on HIGH for 3-4 hours.
- Remove chicken to large mixing bowl, shred, then return to slow cooker.
- Add cream cheese and stir, then cover and cook on HIGH for 15 minutes, or until chili is creamy and slightly thickened.
- Serve with your favorite chili toppings and ENJOY! (Topping ideas: shredded cheese, tortilla strips, sour cream, fresh cilantro, sliced jalapeños, sliced avocado)

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


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
