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Porch Lights Aglow

The long winter nights and short winter days are upon us again. The long dark nights are the perfect opportunity for the criminal element to strike. Studies show the demand is low at that time of day, so there is only a nominal cost. That makes the porch light a relatively inexpensive way to protect your valuables. For the best savings, use a 40 watt, 130 volt bulb. Light also prevents accidents.

Complaint Procedure

Who May Submit Complaints? Complaints regarding alleged violations of the Covenants, Design Guidelines or Rules and Regulations may be reported by members of the Board of Directors, members of the Community or the Association's Manager.

How Complaints Should be Submitted: Complaints by a member of the community shall be in writing and must include a contact name and email address or phone number in case there is an inquiry from the Board or management office regarding the complaint submitted. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. Your name and contact information will not be provided to the person you have made a complaint about; it is only needed for the management team. The member must have observed the alleged violation and shall contain the nature of the alleged violation, the location of the alleged violation and the date it was observed, photos are very helpful. A complaint may also be submitted by any member of the Board of Directors or by the Association Manager after a walk through or inspection of the Community. **You may send your concerns to PCMS via email at support@pcms.net or via fax at 303-224-0002.**

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Microgreens: Friend or Fad? A New Year's Growing Trend

As winter plods on, planting something to beat the winter blues is an attractive idea. Many of us are thinking about fresh ways to bring vegetables into our lives, though outdoor vegetable gardening is a few months away. Enter microgreens: tiny, nutrient-packed plants that promise big rewards in a short time. Are they a passing trend, or here to stay? Let's explore.



Jazzy Blend

What Are Microgreens?

Microgreens are small, edible plants harvested at an early stage of growth. They are slightly larger than sprouts but should not be confused with them. These little greens include a variety of vegetables such as mustard, radish, basil, Swiss chard, kale, cabbage, arugula, and cress. There are also specially designed blends tailored to top sandwiches or salads.

One of the best things about microgreens is how quickly they grow. From seed to harvest, the whole process takes just 10 days. For those new to gardening, especially kids, growing microgreens is an exciting activity. Watching the plants grow so quickly can inspire young gardeners and teach them about the cycle of plant life—right in the comfort of home.

Why Grow Microgreens?

Microgreens are rarely sold in grocery stores and when they are they are expensive due to fragility of the product and packaging required. Microgreens grow incredibly fast providing a fast payoff in the doldrums of winter. Plus, they are nutritional powerhouses containing vitamins A, B, C and antioxidants.

How to Grow Microgreens

Seeds can be procured at your local garden center. I have recently tried cilantro microgreens and the Jazzy Mix offered by Botanical Interests®. For step by step directions with pictures, visit An Edible Project for Winter Green Thumbs – Pueblo County Extension.

Growing microgreens is easy and doesn't require much space. Here's a simple step-by-step guide to get you started:

- 1. Procure Seed Starting Mix or Potting Mix** – Start by moistening the mix.
- 2. Fill a Container** – You can use a six-pack from your local nursery or even clear to-go containers with lids. Anything that can hold the mix and allow for drainage works.
- 3. Sow the Seeds** – Sprinkle the seeds generously over the soil.
- 4. Water** – Use a spray bottle to moisten the soil.
- 5. Cover** – Place foil or a lid over the container to block light for the first day. This encourages leggy plants that will reach for the light, making them easier to harvest.
- 6. Light Exposure** – On day two or three, move the container to a sunny window or under grow lights.
- 7. Harvest** – Once the first true leaves appear (after the cotyledons, baby leaves), it's time to harvest. Snip off the greens with clean scissors just above the soil level.

How to Harvest and Store Microgreens

Once your microgreens are ready, use clean scissors to trim them just above the soil level. Be sure to harvest them fresh, as their shelf life is short. If you're not using them right away, store them in a container lined with a paper towel in the fridge. They'll stay fresh for about 3-5 days if kept cool and dry. Wash before eating.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES: For the health and safety of our workers, please make sure all recyclable materials in your curbside bins are washed out and clean and follow the below guidelines.

- Empty and rinse all containers
- Place recyclables loose and unbagged in your curbside recycling container
- Flatten all cardboard/paperboard boxes
- Place your recycling container 4ft from parked cars and other obstacles

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: What items CAN be recycled?

Paper: mixed paper | newspapers, magazines, catalogs | cardboard | cartons | paperboard | phonebooks & paperback books
Plastics: Clean and rinsed out rigid plastic bottles and containers | No food residue No plastic bags |No Styrofoam |No hard plastic items
Metals: aluminum cans, foil, pie plates | steel cans | loose metal jar lids & bottle caps
Glass: Clean and washed out glass in your curbside recycling bin| No food residue

NOT ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: What items CAN NOT be recycled?

NO GARBAGE| NO STYROFOAM® | NO ELECTRONICS | NO SCRAP METAL
NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM: We cannot accept plastic bags. Plastic bags can be recycled at most local grocery stores.
NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTICS: We accept plastics #1-7. Some plastics that are not recyclable: Styrofoam, hard plastic items including toys, plastic chairs, flower pots, PVC pipes & any other plastics that are not listed in these guidelines.
NO LIQUIDS OR FOOD RESIDUE: Please completely empty and rinse out all containers.
NO CERAMICS OR OTHER GLASS PRODUCTS: Do not place glass, ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, porcelain, or window glass in your recycling container.
NO HAZARDOUS WASTE: No hazardous waste such as oil-based paint, automotive fluids, car batteries, fertilizers or pesticides. Latex paint recycling locations can be found on PaintCare.org.
