Spring 2026 Fence Staining Touch-Up Notice:

We will be touching-up all the previously-stained fences in our community starting the week of April 6th, weather permitting. For those owners who have a side and/or rear yard fence that is next to a public right of way street or common area within the community, as you are aware, the Association has stained your fence in the past for the overall aesthetic benefit of all homeowners in the community. The Association would appreciate your attention in having any necessary repairs made to your fence no later than March 31st, 2026 to include replacement of missing or broken slats, reattaching any slats that have come loose, or the replacement of any bad posts, etc. Commencing in April, a qualified contractor retained by the Association will be touching-up those portions of your fence that have been stained in the past. If for any reason you do not make all necessary repairs to your fence by March 31, 2026, the contractor retained by the Association providing the staining of the fences will provide a quote to the Association for the necessary repairs, and upon written approval by the Association will make those repairs, with the associated costs to be billed back to each respective owner.

Pickups may be delayed due to hazardous materials in containers, such as motor oil, which require the truck to halt for safe cleanup, extra pickups, including this year's heavy leaf volume, which causes trucks to fill faster and requires additional trucks, or weather conditions. 

Architectural Answers

Welcome to **Architectural Answers!** This section is here to help answer some of the most common questions we receive about exterior improvements to your home and lot. Each month, we'll highlight a different topic to make the process a little clearer and easier to navigate.

To start with the basics: in most cases, approval is required for any exterior change to your home or property, unless the Community Guidelines specifically state otherwise. This includes modifications, additions, or alterations. Generally, true "like-for-like" replacements, standard repairs, or repainting using your existing approved color scheme do not require approval.

Before beginning any project, we encourage you to review your Association's Community Guidelines, which are available on the Association website. Taking a few minutes to check the guidelines first can save time and prevent delays.

When submitting a request, please be sure to complete the "Description of Improvements" section with a detailed explanation of your project. Simply writing "see attached" isn't sufficient, as a written description helps ensure your request can be reviewed as quickly as possible.

If you have questions or would like guidance before submitting, the Design Review department is happy to help! You can reach out via email at designreview@pcms.net.

Application Review Procedure of the Architectural Committee (AC)

Our AC has established a process for the receipt, review and response of all design review requests. The AC will schedule and convene meetings as necessary to review homeowner applications submitted to the management company, PCS. There are two deadlines per month for submission, the first and third Fridays of the month at noon. The Modifications Committee then tries to get their responses to me by the third Friday of the month or first Friday of the following month, respectively. Please note that while the AC tries to adhere to the noted turnaround time, per the Guidelines they have 45 days to review your request. Once a response has been provided, a response letter may be mailed to the address on file and will also be available by logging into the homeowner portal. Please email designreview@pcms.net with any questions and/or to submit your request for review.

Complaint Procedure

Who May Submit Complaints? Complaints regarding alleged violations of the Covenants, Design Guidelines or Rules and Regulations may be reported by members of the Board of Directors, members of the Community or the Association's Manager.

How Complaints Should be Submitted: Complaints by a member of the community shall be in writing and must include a contact name and email address or phone number in case there is an inquiry from the Board or management office regarding the complaint submitted. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. *Your name and contact information will not be provided to the person you have made a complaint about;* it is only needed for the management team. The member must have observed the alleged violation and shall contain the nature of the alleged violation, the location of the alleged violation and the date it was observed, photos are very helpful. A complaint may also be submitted by any member of the Board of Directors or by the Association Manager after a walk through or inspection of the Community. **You may send your concerns to PCS via email at support@pcms.net or via fax at 303-224-0002.**

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

For the health and safety of our workers, please make sure all recyclable materials in your curbside bins are washed out and clean and follow the below guidelines.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

What items CAN be recycled?

Paper

- Mixed paper
- Newspapers, magazines, and catalogs
- Cardboard
- Cartons
- Paperboard
- Phonebooks and paperback books

Plastics

- Rigid plastic
- Bottles and containers
- Plastics #1-7

Metals

- Aluminum cans, foil, and pie plates
- Steel cans
- Loose metal jar lids and bottle caps

Glass

- We are now accepting clean and washed out glass in your curbside recycling bin.

Please

- Empty and rinse all containers
- Place recyclables loose and unbagged in your curbside recycling container
- Flatten all cardboard and paperboard boxes
- Place your recycling container 4 feet from parked cars and other obstacles

NOT ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

What items CAN NOT be recycled?

Please **DO NOT** place the following items in your recycling container:

- NO GARBAGE
- NO PLASTIC BAGS
- NO PLASTIC FILM
- NO STYROFOAM®
- **NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM:** We cannot accept plastic bags in your recycling bin. Plastic bags can be recycled at most local grocery stores.
- **NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTICS:** We accept plastics #1-7 but there are some plastics that are not recyclable. These products include Styrofoam, hard plastic items including toys, plastic chairs, flower pots, PVC pipes and any other plastic products that are not listed in these guidelines.
- **NO LIQUIDS OR FOOD RESIDUE:** Please completely empty and rinse out all containers before recycling.
- **NO CERAMICS OR OTHER GLASS PRODUCTS:** Do not place glass, ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, porcelain, or window glass in your recycling container.
- **NO SCRAP METAL:** Do not place scrap metal items of any size in your curbside recycling container.
- **NO ELECTRONICS**
- **NO HAZARDOUS WASTE:** No hazardous waste such as oil-based paint, automotive fluids, car batteries, fertilizers or pesticides. Latex paint recycling locations can be found on PaintCare.org.



Is it Easy to Grow Columbines in Colorado?

Like any good question, this one opens up a can of (earth)worms. It depends on which columbines you want to grow, and what your site is like. Columbines (genus *Aquilegia*) are a large group of plants, and you can find a good columbine for a broad spectrum of garden sites as long as the conditions are not completely dry. Rock garden species can require perfect drainage, and tend to be more challenging than the “garden varieties.” While easier to grow, these larger plants are no less charming than their diminutive counterparts. Let’s take a look at a few of them.

Colorado Columbines

If you hear about columbines in Colorado, you will likely think of the state flower, the “Colorado columbine,” or *Aquilegia coerulea*. This classic pale blue/lavender and white gem can be found growing in damp places in the foothills up to nearly timberline. It prefers cool, somewhat shaded conditions and moist soil that drains reasonably well. Lower-elevation gardeners may struggle to provide this, but luckily, some other options are out there.

Hybrid Columbines

A good many garden columbines are hybrids of two or more species. They’ve been chosen for a variety of colors and flower forms. If you’d like a Colorado columbine but are gardening at lower elevation, you might consider growing the REMEMBRANCE™ Columbine, *Aquilegia* “Swan Violet and White.” Its rich purple-and-white blooms are a good imitation of the state flower. Other hybrids can be red, pink, yellow, cream, pale blue, and either single or double. No columbine is particularly long-lived, though they do tend to reproduce on their own from seed in the garden. If you have more than one kind (or even if your neighbor does), prepare to have the offspring not look like the parents—columbines cross-pollinate easily!



Common Columbine

The European common columbine, *Aquilegia vulgaris*, is a parent of many of the hybrid types and can be grown on its own in Colorado gardens as well. It prefers similar conditions to the others we’ve discussed—light shade and rich, moist soil that still drains. Common columbine flowers are often a single color.

DENVER GOLD® Columbine

The yellow-flowering columbine, *Aquilegia chrysantha*, (promoted by Plant Select as DENVER GOLD®) is perhaps the most durable columbine that lower-elevation gardeners in Colorado can choose. This species is native to (the damper parts of) Arizona and other western states. It is the most tolerant of dry, clay soil of the typical garden columbines, but it still likes to have extra water, which doubtless reminds it of its home in the canyon bottoms. The flowers are cheerful yellow, with long spurs. This species will seed around quite a bit if it’s happy, and the gold flower color is dominant when combining with other varieties. If you’re growing more than one variety and DENVER GOLD® is in the mix, I hope you like yellow.

Common Challenges

Given moderately developed garden soil, some supplemental water, and afternoon shade, these columbines will all grow well in most Colorado gardens. Cutting the flower stalks back after bloom can prolong plants’ lives, but no columbine is long-lived. Leave some seedheads to allow for natural propagation, but remember that the offspring won’t always look like the parent plants. Columbine leaf miners, a type of native fly, can disfigure the leaves but aren’t usually a threat to the plants’ health. Sawflies (a wasp-relative whose larvae look like caterpillars) can defoliate whole plants, and are usually taken more seriously. The larvae feed at night; a trip to the garden with a flashlight and a cup of soapy water (or your fingernails, if you’re not squeamish), can usually resolve an infestation. If you’ve had problems with these before, scout frequently to catch the issue early.

More information

We’ve only scratched the surface of the world of columbines, and more species even for the novice gardener are out there to try, including western natives like red columbine (*Aquilegia formosa*). If you’re interested in making columbines a part of your gardening life, I can’t recommend highly enough the book *Columbines: Aquilegia, Paraquilegia and Semiaquilegia* by eminent Colorado horticulturist Robert Nold, to whose work I hope this little article will draw your attention.
