The Dog Days of Summer:

What They Mean and Where the Phrase Came From

The "dog days of summer" refer to the hottest, most humid stretch of the year, typically occurring from early July through mid-August in the Northern Hemisphere. While many people associate the phrase with lazy dogs seeking shade from the heat, its true origin comes from the stars.

The expression dates back to ancient Rome, when people noticed that the brightest star in the night sky, Sirius—also known as the "Dog Star" because it is part of the constellation Canis Major (the Greater Dog)—rose in the sky around the same time as the Sun during the peak of summer. The Romans believed the combined heat of Sirius and the Sun contributed to the season's sweltering temperatures.

Although modern astronomy has shown that Sirius has no effect on Earth's weather, the phrase has endured for more than 2,000 years. Today, "the dog days of summer" is simply a colorful way to describe the long, hot days when temperatures soar, afternoons seem to slow down, and people look for ways to stay cool.

Whether spent at the beach, by the pool, or relaxing in the shade, the dog days of summer remain one of the most recognizable—and hottest—times of the year.

Covenant Corner



During routine inspections, it was observed that some homes may be in need of **Exterior Painting**, as one or more of the following conditions may be present: fading, exposed wood, bleeding, chipping, or peeling paint. The Association encourages homeowners to take a look at their property and begin making arrangements for any needed repairs or repainting.

Some **driveways** may also be in need of repair and/or replacement due to cracking, sinking, and/or displaced areas.

The Association appreciates your attention in addressing any necessary repairs and/or replacements. Please take a moment to review the Community Covenants, Guidelines at wwwFOUNDERSMasterHOA.com and any applicable Resolutions regarding requirements for driveway repairs/replacements and exterior paint prior to scheduling work. **Modification Committee approval is required before any work commences for projects involving changes or modifications.**

As a reminder, cooler and rainy days are often the best conditions for weed control and manually hand-pulling weeds. Use those overcast days to tackle general routine upkeep and yard maintenance, including:

- Bed weeding
- Fertilizing
- Regular mowing
- Pruning and trimming
- Reviewing your water management program

(Definition of a weed: a plant held to have no value, especially one growing plentifully and detrimentally in a garden, lawn, or bed area.)

Please also take a moment to check your sprinkler system to ensure sprinkler heads and emitters are directed properly and functioning correctly.

The Association appreciates your continued attention in maintaining your property and helping preserve the overall appearance of the community.

Architectural Answers

With the extreme heat and lack of precipitation we have been experiencing over the past several months, conserving water and adhering to water restrictions is a real concern.

Xeriscaping and/or reducing the amount of sod is allowed, and pre-approved landscaping options are available for your convenience on the community website, www.foundersmasterhoa.com.

Please keep in mind that xeriscape landscaping designs require as much, if not more, care and maintenance; they simply do not require as much water. All xeriscape landscaping plans require a functioning irrigation system to help maintain the plantings.

Please be advised that any changes to existing landscaping and/or the installation of new landscaping require approval prior to work commencing. If you have any questions, please email designreview@pcms.net directly.

Application Review Procedure of the Architectural Control Committee (ACC)

The Architectural Control Committee (ACC) has established a process for the receipt, review, and response to all design review requests submitted to the management company, PCS. The ACC schedules and convenes meetings as necessary to review homeowner applications.

The ACC will make every effort to provide responses to requests within 5–7 business days from the date the application is checked in. However, please note that while the ACC strives to adhere to this turnaround time, the Governing Documents and Guidelines provide the Committee with up to 45 days to review requests.

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Complaint Procedure

Who May Submit Complaints? Complaints regarding alleged violations of the Covenants, Design Guidelines or Rules and Regulations may be reported by members of the Board of Directors, members of the Community or the Association's Manager.

How Complaints Should Be Submitted: Complaints by a member of the community shall be in writing and must include a contact name and email address or phone number in case there is an inquiry from the Board or management office regarding the complaint submitted. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. *Your name and contact information will not be provided to the person you have made a complaint about; it is only needed for the management team and for owner verification.* The member must have observed the alleged violation and shall contain the nature of the alleged violation, the location of the alleged violation and the date it was observed; photos are very helpful. A complaint may also be submitted by any member of the Board of Directors or by the Association Manager after a walk through or inspection of the Community.

The Second Spring: Your August Planting Guide for Douglas County Don't Put Those Garden Gloves Away Just Yet!

As a Master Gardener Apprentice right here in Douglas County, I often hear neighbors say they are "winding down" their gardens once August hits. But here's a local secret: August is actually our "Second Spring!" While the summer heat is still lingering, the shortening days and cooler nights signal a whole new cast of characters that it's their time to shine.

In our high-altitude environment, the first frost typically arrives between late September and early October. This gives us a beautiful 60-to-70-day window to squeeze in one more delicious harvest before the snow flies.

What to Plant Now for a Fall Feast

Focus on "cool-season" crops. These plants actually prefer the declining temperatures, and in some cases, a light kiss of frost makes them taste even sweeter.

1. The "Speed Demons" (Ready in 25–40 days)

These are perfect for the impatient gardener (like me!).

Radishes: These are the sprinters of the garden. Plant them now and you'll be slicing them into salads in less than a month.

Spinach & Arugula: These greens bolt (go to seed) in the July heat, but in the August cooling trend, they stay lush and tender.

Lettuce: Stick to leaf varieties rather than head lettuce for a quicker turnaround.

2. The "Crunchy Staples" (Ready in 50–60 days)

Carrots: Look for "short" or "finger" varieties. Carrots grown in the cooling soil of autumn are remarkably sweet because the plant converts starches to sugars to act as a natural antifreeze.

Beets: Both the roots and the earthy greens are fantastic fall harvests.

Kale & Swiss Chard: These are the tough guys of the Douglas County garden. They can handle a light freeze and will keep producing well into October.

3. Herbs that Love the Chill

Cilantro & Dill: These notoriously "finicky" herbs hate the summer sun but thrive in the late-season breeze.

Parsley: A biennial that will stay green even when the first dusting of snow hits the Foothills.

4. Fruits: The Strawberry Strategy

While most fruit trees and bushes need to be planted in spring, August is a great time to manage your Strawberry Starts. If you have runners coming off your main plants, now is the time to tuck them into the soil or move them into towers to establish roots before winter dormancy.

Pro-Tips for High-Altitude Success

Hydration is Key: August in Colorado is notoriously dry. Even though the air is cooling, keep your seed beds moist. A light layer of mulch can help hold that precious moisture in.

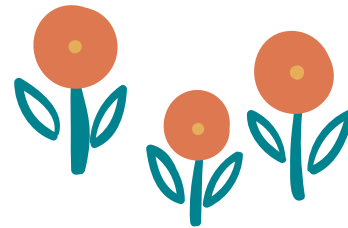
Mind the Wind: Those late-summer gusts can dry out tender seedlings in hours. If you're planting in an exposed area, consider a temporary windbreak.

Frost Prep: Keep some row covers or old bedsheets handy. If we get a surprise early frost in September, covering your plants overnight can extend your season by weeks!

Ready to get started?

Grab your seeds and head out this evening when the sun is low. There is nothing quite like the flavor of a "Second Spring" harvest enjoyed on a crisp October afternoon.

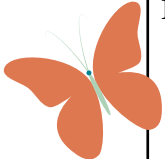
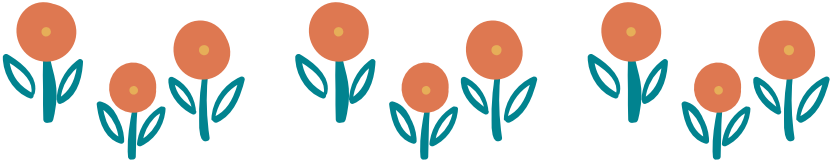

Metals

Aluminum cans, foil, and pie plates | Steel cans

Loose metal jar lids and bottle caps

Glass NO FOOD RESIDUE

We are now accepting clean and washed out glass in your curbside recycling bin.

NOT ACCEPTABLE RECYCLING ITEMS

What items CAN NOT be recycled?

Please DO NOT place the following products in your curbside recycling container.

NO GARBAGE | NO PLASTIC BAGS | NO PLASTIC FILM | NO STYROFOAM®

NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM: We cannot accept plastic bags in your curbside recycling bin. Plastic bags can be recycled at most local grocery stores.

NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTICS: We accept plastics #1-7 but there are some plastics that are not recyclable. These products include Styrofoam, hard plastic items including toys, plastic chairs, flower pots, PVC pipes and any other plastic products that are not listed in these guidelines.

NO LIQUIDS OR FOOD RESIDUE: Please completely empty and rinse out all containers before recycling.

NO CERAMICS OR OTHER GLASS PRODUCTS: Do not place glass, ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex, porcelain, or window glass in your curbside recycling container.

NO SCRAP METAL: Do not place scrap metal items of any size in your curbside recycling container.

NO ELECTRONICS: Do not place electronic devices in your curbside recycling container.

NO HAZARDOUS WASTE: We do not accept hazardous waste such as oil-based paint, automotive fluids, car batteries, fertilizers or pesticides. Latex paint recycling locations can be found on PaintCare.org.
